RACING BEGINS IN 79 DAYS!

<u>Roger Bauman, Fleet Captain</u>: Sheridan and I have been members since the early 90's, we have three girls, Avery, Ingrid and Carolyn and live in Westbrook. As Fleet Captain I am responsible for our three boats and the dry storage area.



While I am no boat mechanic, I am lucky to have the advice and support of many club members to help solve problems. Last winter our project was to design and have built a new aluminum boat/dinghy ramp. Mark Kondracky helped with the bulkhead rebuild and Todd McKenzie of Smedley Crane hoisted the ramp into position. This solved the undue stress the old wooden ramp was putting on the docks and made for better launching and hauling of our one design dinghies. This winter we have two projects, first to fix Sitting Duck's motor imbalance problem and also to assess Mighty Duck's engine performance to insure chase boat reliability. Jeff Sturgess, a new member who is an accomplished airplane mechanic

turned Delta pilot and I ran Sitting Duck last fall and identified the transmission as the culprit. We removed the transmission from Sitting Duck and had it rebuilt at Sound Marine Diesel, who verified the forward gear was damaged. The rebuild is now complete and plans are to reinstall once the weather breaks. We had several reports last summer of Mighty Duck's 115hp Suzuki engine losing power and not idling well. The last major repair was about 5 years ago to the exhaust manifold, at the time Greg's outboard shop said we should get 2-3 years on it. We are assessing the engine to see if we can stretch the motor for another season or whether to replace it this spring, any leads on a gently used or new engine are appreciated. I am looking forward to seeing our club come alive again this spring with another season of racing and cruising. Until then see you on the slopes or at DIYC! **Roger's vision for DIYC in 2024 is**..."to have a year of good times sailing w/great friends!"
