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***Let's celebrate our officer volunteers who have served for 6+ years!***

Based on our website's officer tab I added up years of officer volunteerism from 2003-2023. I emailed all with 6+ years and asked each one to share what it meant to hold those positions, their future wishes for DIYC and any other caring words they wished to share! ***21+yrs of service (STANDING OVATION) Dick Saunders!!***

**Webmaster, Admin assistant to Rear Commodore Race, Race Committee Volunteer, Condo Owner and often helps w/maintenance at our club!  
Also "Right Hand Man" to most everyone!!!**



How did I become the DIYC webmaster and the guy behind the scenes supporting the race chairman in the administration of the club racing program? Long story.

As a teenager in 1952 my stepfather owned a 15-foot wooden cat boat and later a wooden 21-foot sloop that he kept in a marina in New London. We, my mom, stepdad, sister, and I sailed whenever we could on weekends in the Thames River and Fishers Island Sound. I also had a friend who had built a 10-foot sailing dinghy that he and I enjoyed sailing in the Niantic River.

After a four-year stint in the air force, I met and married Phyllis and started a family. Years went by until 1976 when we were vacationing in Brewster, MA on the bay side of Cape Cod I was invited to try sailing a Sunfish. My boys and I loved it. The next year I bought two Sunfishes and a trailer and sailed them that summer at the Cape as well as in Long Island Sound out of Clinton. I was hooked and converted one of them to a Super Sunfish Marconi rig. In 1981 I bought my first "real boat", a Cape Dory Typhon, then in 1982 a yellow Able 20, and in 1986 an Albin Cumulus 28 footer, "Cloud Dancer" that I day sailed, cruised and raced part time at DIYC for 20 years. My two sons and I raced her actively in the Wednesday Night Series and the ECSA events from 1990 to 1994. After that I raced periodically in the ECSA events with friends and cruised singlehandedly to anchorages in Gardiners Bay and Block Island. In 2002 or 2003 I finally joined the club. I sold her in the summer of 2006, and bought my current boat, a Frers 33, "Out of Reach II" in early 2007. I dropped the "II" and kept the name.



Dave Gilmore, the vice commodore in 2004, asked me if I'd like to take over as webmaster as the current webmaster, Mark Marsella, was finding less free time to keep the site current, especially in posting results. Since I am a retired ex-IBMer, I figured, how hard can it be? So, I installed Front Page 2003 on my home desktop computer and after an afternoon of tutoring from Mark I was set loose to figure it out. Front Page 2003 is a WYSIWYG (what you see is what you get) program. As such one doesn't have to learn a lot of HTML and is relatively easy to use. Nevertheless, it was a learning curve for me and I'm still learning.

Mike Sinsi was the race chairman in 2004-2005 and he would give me the scratch sheets and results to post. I learned to use the RaceSail program that Mike was using. The following year Bob Connell became the race chairman and I started doing all the RaceSail stuff to support him, and all the race chairs ever since. In 2020 the club started using Yachtscoring which makes my job much easier, and the results are posted online as they are entered. **Whenever I can I join the race committee boat crew for the club races throughout the year. They are great people, all volunteers, and we do have a lot of fun.**

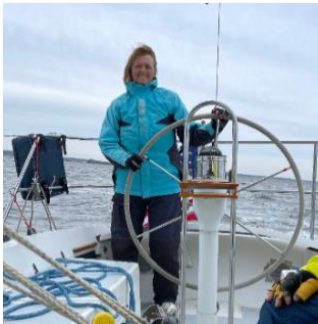

## Rum Swizzle

### Ingredients (Makes 6)

- 4 oz Goslings Black Seal Rum
- 4 oz Goslings Gold Rum\*
- 5 oz Pineapple Juice
- 5 oz Orange Juice
- ¾ oz Grenadine or 2 oz Bermuda Falernum
- 6 Dashes of Angostura Bitters

### Method

Into a pitcher ¼ full of crushed ice add Goslings Black Seal Rum, Goslings Gold Rum, pineapple juice, orange juice, Grenadine or Bermuda Falernum and Angostura bitters. Churn vigorously until a frothing appears or mix in a cocktail shaker. Strain into a martini glass.

\* Gold Seal Rum can be substituted with equivalent amount of Black Seal Rum.
