Member Spotlight

2024 Club Steward/Assistants and Race Committee Volunteers

What we do: It all starts when our Club Steward arrives to get the marks ready, along with the boats. All other race committee arrive, hop on either Sitting Duck (our signal boat) or Mighty Duck (our chase boat). While underway the Professional Race Officer (PRO) starts to check the weather including wind, wind speed, wind direction, forecasts and picks a location to drop anchor. A course will be chosen based on the weather and will be posted on our course board. Mighty Duck will head out to set the marks. (Usually a windward mark and on occasion a leeward mark) One member on Sitting Duck will log all race boats that are required to come by to check in. Mighty Duck will come back and set another mark to set the start line (which is usually perpendicular to the windward mark). Flags are organized and are ready to be deployed

Start sequence...1st warning at 6:30pm Class flag goes up. After 1 min prep flag goes up (stays up for 3 min) After a 4 min prep flag goes down w/horn. I minute to go. And Class I flag goes down and Class 2 flag goes up. Rolling Starts....look for people over early and we give courtesy call over the radio.

A fun perk is now we get to sit back, and watch the race looking for good competition while being ready for finishers. As boats approach the finish line the PRO will set themself up to see the finish line and blows a horn as each boat crosses the line. Someone is on a timer calling out times. Someone else is logging those times on the scoresheet. Usually we haves 2 scorers. Once every one finishes the marks get picked up and deflated and everyone motors in and heads to the club for food and drinks. The final thing to do is someone inputs the scores into Yachtscoring.

And last but surely not least is that everyone has fun!






